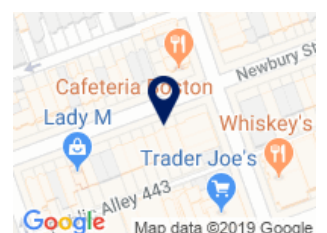

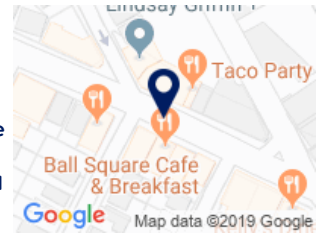




True Grounds
